Semaglutide Injection Steps NEW For 5mg/ml Vial

Assemble supplies

You will need your medication vial, one of the provided syringes, and an alcohol swab.

Wash hands & prepare injection site

Clean the injection site with the alcohol swab and let the skin dry.

Draw up the medication

- 1) Remove the seal on the top of the vial and wipe with alcohol
- 2) Remove the orange cap off the needle
- 3) Hold the syringe like you hold a pen or a dart, inserting the needle into the middle of the rubber stopper perpendicular, so the needle does not bend.
- 4) Together, turn the vial and syringe upside down.
- 5) Make sure the tip of the needle is in the liquid.
- 6) Pull the plunger down, past the dosage prescribed. Then, push up to the prescribed dosage, as this will remove all air bubbles.
- 7) Once you have the correct amount of liquid, pull the entire syringe out of the vial.

Subcutaneous Injection

- 1) Pinch the injection site to create a firm surface.
- 2) Inject two inches on either side of the belly button or back of arm or thigh.
- 3) Insert the needle into the skin between the index finger and thumb at 90 degrees.
- 4) Using a slow and constant pressure, push the plunger rod until it reaches the bottom.
- 5) Gently pull the syringe out of the skin.
- 6) Discard the needle in a sharps container or plastic bottle with top.

Always check your medication to ensure it is clear and colorless. Contact your provider if the liquid is cloudy, discolored, or contains particles.

Dosage

The medication is administered once weekly, on the same day each week. Injections can be done at any time of the day, with or without meals. If you are on...

0.75mg - fill syringe to 15 mark
1.25mg - fill syringe to 25 mark
1.75 mg - fill syringe to 35 mark
2.25 mg - fill syringe to 45 mark
2.5 mg - fill syringe to 50 mark

(to get the last bit out of product out of vial - carefully remove metal ring using bottle opener and pull rubber stopper out)

Storage

Keep semaglutide injections out of reach of children. Semaglutide does not need to be refrigerated.

Continue seeing the doctor

It is important that your doctor check your progress in regular monthly visits.

Possible side effects

loss of appetite light-headed or dizzy persistent lethargic feeling gastrointestinal discomfort/pain diarrhea nausea or vomiting
